Happy 50th Birthday to Island Packers

Back in the mid-1960s, Bill Connally was an engineer by trade, an adventurer at heart and a resident of coastal Ventura County. Ultimately, his heart and the ocean pulled him from his desk job and drew him to the sea – and specifically to the local Pacific waters and islands that make up the Channel Islands National Park.

With a future maritime life in mind, Connally bought a boat – a dilapidated old passenger boat, a World War II vintage converted Navy launch – and on weekends, he, his wife Lil and their four children worked together refurbishing it.

On Mother's Day 1968, Bill Connally christened the boat *Island Packer* and launched his tourism company, offering the boat for charters out of Ventura Harbor, to two of the five Channel Islands: Anacapa and Santa Cruz.

The Island Packers business took off, with thousands getting on board each year and with charters eventually going to all the Channel Islands. But winters were always hard and over the years the company barely survived some trying times – including Bill Connally's death in 1987.

The Connally family kept the patriarch's beloved company, and in the more than 30 years since they took it over, they've driven its growth and success as a local institution. In fact, over the past decade, Island Packers' business has been booming at Ventura Harbor, where its

Holiday Inn Express is Expanding

A 40-room expansion is underway at the Holiday Inn Express at Ventura Harbor. When completed, the expansion will bring to 109 the total number of rooms available at the inn, at 1080 Navigator Drive. A complete renovation of the building – including a new lobby and a larger breakfast room – is slated for 2019. Newport Beach-based Brighton Management has owned and operated both the Holiday Inn Express and Four Points Sheraton at the harbor since 2006.

Plans Advance for Sustainable Mussel Farm off Ventura Coast

The Ventura Port District is moving forward with plans to pre-permit commercial mussel farms in the ocean off Ventura.

The Ventura Shellfish Enterprise (VSE) seeks to farm sustainably cultivated mussels in the Santa Barbara Channel off Ventura Harbor. Supported by a \$300,000 grant, the Ventura Port District, as a VSE member, plans to submit applications by August for permits to farm the mussels within federal waters. Federal and state agency review and public participation in the review process would follow.

The Mediterranean mussels, which grow throughout the Santa Barbara Channel, would be farmed by commercial fishermen and landed at existing fish offloading facilities in the Ventura Harbor. This would expand and diversify commercial fishing activities in the Harbor, provide new opportunities for local fishermen, and bring a new source of fresh seafood to the public that is grown using sustainable and responsible practices.

Once fully operational, the farms are projected to bring in an additional \$50 million in revenue to the local economy.

"California continues to import over 90 percent of our shellfish to meet local demand, which in our view is better served by local fishermen delivering locally produced fresh mussels," said Port District Chair Everard Ashworth. "Years from now, when people come to the Harbor to enjoy locally produced fresh mussels, we want everyone to say, 'They got this right.'"

The Port District and VSE partners are seeking permits to support 2,000 acres in federal waters for the farms. Working closely with federal and state agency staff, and in collaboration with several premier sustainability research institutions, they hope to secure approval and be able to land product in the Harbor within three or four years.

Ventura Lifeguards Return for the Summer

Daily lifeguard services run through the summer at Ventura Harbor beaches off Spinnaker Drive.

Unanimously approved for 2018 by the Board of Port Commissioners, these services are funded by the Ventura Port District, which contracts with California State Parks.

The contract runs through Labor Day, with seasonal lifeguards covering the harbor's Surfer's Knoll Beach and Harbor Cove Beach.

Starting and ending times may change throughout the summer to address crowd trends. Harbor Cove lifeguards will begin around 10 a.m. daily, and lifeguarding at Surfer's Knoll will begin by 11 a.m. on weekends. Additional coverage may include a beach patrol.

Port District Welcomes New Commissioner Jean Getchell

Everard Ashworth is Reappointed

Ventura environmental attorney Jean Getchell has been appointed to complete the last year of Commissioner Nikos Valance's term on the Port District Board.

A Ventura native and an attorney since 1995, Getchell previously served on the Port District board from 1996-1999. She returns after being interviewed and selected by the City Council Appointments Committee. "I emphasized the importance of the commission, city, business community and citizens working together," said Getchell, who will serve until Valance's term expires on June 30, 2019.

Valance, an attorney, economist and environmentalist originally from New York, had served on the voluntary board since his appointment on July 27, 2015, and he recently resigned.

In other board news, Commissioner Everard Ashworth has been appointed to serve another term. Ashworth's new term began June 4 and runs through June 30, 2022. Ashworth is a principal with Ashworth Leininger Group, a consulting and engineering firm that provides expertise to business and government on air quality, environmental and coastal zone permitting issues.

Pendleton also was instrumental in negotiating a lease with a new restaurant operator for Harbor Village, slated to open in the first quarter of 2019 in the old Blackbeard space adjacent to the lawn area.

Pendleton has extensive economic development experience and a master's degree in real estate development from the University of Southern California.

"Brian has brought a great deal of professionalism and dedication to the district," said District General Manager Oscar Peña. "We are fortunate to have such a creative and resourceful thinker as part of our executive staff. His promotion to deputy general manager will certainly benefit the district in the future.

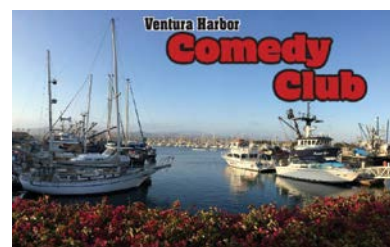
