


Water Supply and Challenges


Ventura is one of the largest cities in Southern California that relies solely on local water sources.

VenturaWaterPure Program Benefits







DROUGHT RESISTANT

Creates a drought-resistant, reliable water supply that isn't dependent on rain








Ocean Outfall Alignment

Ocean Outfall Pipeline Assembly

Ocean Outfall Assembly at Marina Park

- HDD Pipeline 4500 ft
- Seafloor Pipeline 2100 ft

Pull Two Pipelines Through the Harbor

- Estimated pull time -1 day each
- Early May 2024 timeframe

Port District Suggestions Incorporated:

- City will add instructions to keep pipe to one side of the harbor allowing Harbor access at all times
- Outreach to Harbor Community on work schedule



Ocean Outfall Diffuser Assembly

Diffuser Section

- 200 ft pipe 7 risers weights
- scheduled for June 2024 timeframe
- Harbor access to be maintained

Port District Suggestion Incorporated:

 Move from boat launch to VPD Parcel 8 area





Conveyance Pipeline

Comparison	2022 Approved Addendum	2019 Route
Length	7,300 feet	12,000 feet
Traffic impacts on Harbor Boulevard*	1.9 million motorists	6.5 million motorists
Cost estimate	\$4 million	\$5 million
Opportunities to address other needs	Able to rebuild 60- year-old (1963) sewer force main now instead of as a future construction project that would cause additional disruption to area	None identified


Harbor Crossing Horizontal Directional Drill

Pipe Assembly in Anchors Way - North Bound Lane from VPD Dry Boat Storage to Marina MH Community Entrance

Proposed Traffic Control is One Way North from Schooner on the South Bound side

- Approximately 4 months
- Maintain Access to:
 - Marina MH Community
 - Boat Launch Ramp
 - Derecktor Ventura
 - Harbortown Resort
 - VPD Administration, Maintenance, and Harbor Patrol

Complete Closure Required for Approximately 5 Days




Derecktor Ventura

Site of Directional Drill

- Access from Water's Edge Parking Lot
- Concerns about weight of equipment
- Approximately 4 months

Port District Suggestions:

- Second Entrance assessing turning radius
- No impact on current planned development
- Internal temporary accommodations



- Proposed Traffic Control is Rolling Lane Closure with Flaggers
- Approximately 3 months
- Maintain Access to:
 - Marina MH Community
 - > Boat Launch Ramp
 - > Derecktor Ventura


Anchors Way to Reclamation Plant

Schooner Drive

- Proposed Traffic Control is a Lane Closure on the North Side
- Approximately 1 month
- Maintain Access to:
 - ➤ Parcel 19A
 - ➤ Portside
 - > Four Points by Sheraton

Schooner Drive to Reclamation Plant

- Proposed Traffic Control is a Lane Closure on Harbor South Bound Side
- Approximately 4 months




Port District Suggestions:

Temporary Boat Storage at Parcel 19A


- From Derecktor Ventura and VPD
- Investigating median cut for left turn access on Schooner
 - tree removal
 - > temporary light removal
 - > turning radius
- Security fencing and access
- Fire, Police, and Community Development
- Considering use of this lot for Schooner-Anchors Way pipeline installation laydown
- Usage of Lot is approximately 1 year



- e) Appoint an audit liaison to work with staff and the audit firm awarded throughout the fiscal year audit process.






