



PARKING MANAGEMENT IMPLEMENTATION



Harbor Village/Beach Parking

VPD Dry Storage/Future Launch Ramp Overflow

- VHV Parking & Beaches: Free: M-Th, Paid: Fri-Sun + Holidays (10AM 8PM)
- Spinnaker Drive: Free
- Launch Ramp + LR Overflow: Paid 24 Hours per day, 7 Days per week
- Relocate Dry Storage to Harbor & Schooner (blue area)
- Overflow parking at Harbor + Schooner: Free
- Goal to Implement by Spring 2025

Ventura Yacht Club

- District transitioning to zero-emissions fleet & installing EV chargers.
- Tsunami & Sea Level Rise design standards created in 2014. All new marinas required to comply.
- Storm surge & tsunami trends impacting beaches & dunes more frequently.
- Additional goals to reduce waste including single-use materials & plastics.





PUBLIC SAFETY

- District working more closely with City public safety to improve response time & reduce frequency & impacts of criminal activities w/in the Harbor (e.g. theft, violence, trespassing, illegal lodging, public intoxication, etc.)
- Popularity of the Harbor is increasing the number of overlapping uses of inner harbor & beaches
- Growing number of commercial, recreational and other user groups seek to operate in the harbor






